## Executive Summary

Monroe Community Action Agency manages Community Services Block Grant funding for Monroe and Pike counties in the Pocono region of Northeastern Pennsylvania. The Community Services Block Grant is federal funding used to provide services that address the needs of people with income below 125\% of the federal poverty level. These services fall under six national goals:

1. Low-income people become more self-sufficient.
2. The conditions in which low-income people live are improved.
3. Low-income people own a stake in their community.
4. Partnerships among supporters and providers of service to low- income people are achieved.
5. Agencies increase their capacity to achieve results.
6. Low-income people, especially vulnerable populations, achieve their potential by strengthening family and other supportive systems.

Under the leadership of the Monroe Community Action Agency Board of Directors, this Community Needs Assessment was prepared by reviewing, analyzing, and interpreting secondary data from the U.S. Census Bureau and other reliable sources, conducting four focus groups that engaged 39 people, and through a community survey that was completed by 675 individuals. These data were triangulated to identify the five greatest needs for the two-county region:

- Housing: Access to affordable, high-quality housing
- Economic Stability: Access to living wage jobs and financial literacy programs
- Health: Opportunities to improve health and access healthcare, including behavioral health services and food access
- Youth Development: Access to childcare and youth activities
- Reduced Barriers to Services: Improved communication and collaboration among service providers, more outreach and education, improved transportation

To address these needs, Monroe Community Action Agency will pursue seven (7) strategies:

1. Continue to provide core operating support for the local social service network.
2. Streamline the application review process to encourage the participation of lowincome people in evaluation of proposals
3. Align the proposal evaluation matrix with the needs identified in this Community Needs Assessment.
4. Fully utilize the CAPTAIN® Information System.
5. Ensure that people in the community have access to an up-to-date and comprehensive Information and Referral system.
6. Collaborate with other public and private agencies in neighboring counties to leverage resources and increase the Pocono region's capacity to effectively address needs.
7. Engage and educate local municipalities about housing needs and opportunities.

This Community Needs Assessment was developed to guide the activities of Monroe Community Action Agency in Monroe and Pike Counties in Northeastern Pennsylvania. Community Action Agencies are required by law to develop "both a long-range strategy and specific, short-range plans for using potential resources" that considers "the areas of greatest community need, the availability of resources, and its own strengths and limitations" (Office of Economic Opportunity Instruction, 1970).

The purpose and processes involved in developing a Community Needs Assessment is articulated in Transmittal No. 49 from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office of Community Services (February 21, 2021) as follows:

1. The entity and its Board complete regular assessments of the entity's overall mission, desired impact(s) and program structure, taking into account:
a. the needs of the community and its residents;
b. the relationship, or context, of the activities supported by the entity to other antipoverty, [and] community development services in the community; and
c. the extent to which the entity's activities contribute to the accomplishment of one or more of the six ROMA national goals.
2. Based upon the periodic assessments described above, the entity and its Board has identified yearly (or multi-annually) specific improvements, or results, it plans to help achieve in the lives of individuals, families, and/or the community as a whole;
3. The entity organizes and operates all its programs, services, and activities toward accomplishing these improvements, or outcomes, including linking with other agencies in the community when services beyond the scope of the entity are required. All staff is helped by the entity to understand the direct or indirect relationship of their efforts to achieving specific client or community outcomes.

The six (6) ROMA national goals referenced above are:

1. Low-income people become more self-sufficient.
2. The conditions in which low-income people live are improved.
3. Low-income people own a stake in their community.
4. Partnerships among supporters and providers of service to low- income people are achieved.
5. Agencies increase their capacity to achieve results.
6. Low-income people, especially vulnerable populations, achieve their potential by strengthening family and other supportive systems.

## Methodology

This Community Needs Assessment gathered data from secondary sources - in particular those made available through, four focus groups, and a survey. Opportunities for community engagement were promoted through conversations with the Monroe Community Action Agency board of directors and program staff, social media posted by both Monroe and Pike Counties, emails to service providers, emails to participants of programs sponsored by both counties (i.e. Emergency Rental Assistance Program), and a press release distributed to contacts in both counties. A webpage dedicated to the project was used to facilitate communication with the public.

Four focus groups were attended by 39 individuals representing organizations from both counties. The focus groups were facilitated by a consultant from Hailstone Economic while a second consultant took notes. The focus group guide is included in this assessment as Appendix A. The results from all four focus groups were compiled, analyzed, and summarized by the consultant.

A community survey was developed to identify needs related to employment, housing, education, transportation, health and healthcare, income and finance, food access, and childcare. Respondents also had the opportunity to provide additional information using open-ended questions. The survey was made available both online and in hard copy as well as in English and Spanish. A copy of the survey is included in this document as Appendix B. The survey was completed by 675 individuals representing both counties. A sample of this size provides $95 \%$ confidence that the responses are within $5 \%$ of the population. Respondents were representative of the population in terms of race, ethnicity, disability status, age, language spoken, and income; however, a small percentage of respondents were men. In addition, $56 \%$ of respondents did not have any children in their household. Most of the participants reported that they have participated in a public benefit program, such as Head Start, SNAP, or public housing, at some point in their lives. The majority of respondents either lived or worked in Plke and Monroe Counties.

The results were analyzed overall and by breaking down responses by where the respondents lived to identify needs specific to each county. In addition, responses were broken down by demographic characteristics as appropriate to interpret the data.

## Community Profile

Monroe Community Action Agency (Monroe CAA) serves Monroe and Pike Counties in Northeastern Pennsylvania. The area is bound by Wayne, Lackawanna, Luzerne, and Carbon Counties to the east, New York State to the north, New Jersey to the east, and Northampton County to the south.


There are no cities in Monroe and Pike Counties. There are six boroughs in the twocounty area: East Stroudsburg, Stroudsburg, Delaware Water Gap, and Mount Pocono Boroughs in Monroe County and Milford and Matamoras Boroughs in Pike County.

The region, along with Wayne and Carbon Counties is known as the Poconos - a nationally recognized tourist destination. The Pocono Mountains Visitors Bureau estimates that 27.9 million people visit the Poconos each year - either for day trips or overnight stays. The Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development estimates that tourists spent $\$ 3.2$ million in Monroe and Pike Counties in 2019 (Economic Impact of Travel \& Tourism in Pennsylvania 2019, Tourism Economics).

## Population

From 2010 to 2020, the total estimated population of the two-county area declined by less than one percent, decreasing from 227,211 people in 2010 to 226,862 people in 2020. While the population of Monroe County declined by 1,515 people, the population in Pike County increased by 1,166 people. The population increase in Pike County ( $2.03 \%$ ) is slightly higher than the increase in Pennsylvania (7.13\%).

While there was a slight decline in population, the number of households increased. This suggests that households, on average, are smaller with fewer people. The number of households increased 7.8\% in Pike County and 4.6\% in Monroe County from 2015 to 2020.

## Demographics

## Race and Ethnicity

The majority of residents in Monroe and Pike Counties are White (77.2\%). Other residents are Black or African American (12.2\%), American Indian or Alaska Native (<1\%), Asian (2.2\%), Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander (<1\%), some other race (3.5\%), or more than one race (4.6\%).

Age
There are 9,647 children under the age of five in Monroe and Pike Counties ( $4.2 \%$ of the population). Another 33,411 (14.7\%) are school age, or between the ages of 5 and 17. About 139,678 people are between the ages of 18 and 64 , representing $61.5 \%$ of residents. The remaining 40,091 residents (17.6\%) are 65 or older. Comparatively, in Pennsylvania, $5.5 \%$ are under age 5, 15.4\% are between the ages of 5 and 17, 61.6\% are between the ages of 18 and 64 , and $17.5 \%$ are 65 or older.

Of 'traditional' working age adults (between the ages of 18 and 64), 21,969 (15.7\%) are between the ages of 18 and $24,24,244$ (17.3\%) are between the ages of 25 and 34 , 24,181 (17.3\%) are between the ages of 35 and 44, 32,646 (23.4\%) are between the ages of 45 and 54 , and 36,658 (26.2\%) are between the ages of 55 and 64 . Comparatively, in Pennsylvania, 14.7\% are between the ages of 18 and 24, 21.7\% are between the ages of 25 and 34, 19.2\% are between the ages of 35 and 44, 21.1\% are between the ages of 45 and 54 , and $23.1 \%$ are between the ages of 55 and 64 . This reflects what some survey respondents suggested, including "many young people leave the area due to not finding jobs that pay enough" and "lack of decent paying jobs have our brightest moving away."

## Citizenship

The majority of residents in the two-county area are native born citizens (86.4\%) while $1.7 \%$ were born in a U.S. territory and $1.5 \%$ were born abroad to U.S. Citizens. Of those who were not born into U.S. citizenship, $71.3 \%$ are naturalized citizens and the remaining 28.7\% are not yet citizens ( 6,024 individuals). The percentage of non-citizens in Pike and Monroe Counties (2.7\%) is lower than the Commonwealth (3.2\%) and the United States (6.6\%).

## Veterans

There are 15,057 veterans in Monroe and Pike Counties representing $15.7 \%$ of the population. Most veterans are men and $53 \%$ are age 65 or older. About 7.7\% of veterans have not completed high school or earned a GED or equivalent while $26.5 \%$ have earned a bachelor's degree or higher.

## Economic Status

Focus group participants noted that income and employment are prevalent concerns in Monroe and Pike Counties, particularly the low wage jobs in the tourism industry, lack of apprenticeship programs and education in the trades, financial literacy, and increasing income results in a loss of benefits. Survey respondents provided examples of the latter point:

- "Due to a raise I recently received I make 30.00 over the snap limit and have been cut off So the 30.00 increase is costing me 400.00 monthly in food"
- "There is no help for those who make too much to get assistance and don't make enough to live"

Survey participants reported that financial literacy, budgeting, credit repair, and saving to purchase a car or a house are their greatest financial concerns.

## Entrepreneurship and Small Business

There are many small businesses in Monroe and Pike County. About 22\% of jobs in Monroe County, and $37 \%$ of jobs in Pike County, are with companies that have fewer than 20 employees. In addition, about 10\% of households in Monroe County, and 11\% in Pike County, have self-employment income.

## Child Care

Focus group participants noted that the capacity of local childcare centers is a concern, particularly staffing issues and the lack of care during second and third shift. The staffing
needs of childcare facilities have grown since the COVID-19 pandemic. Lack of quality, reliable childcare impedes residents ability to maintain employment and pursue education. It also jeopardizes children's ability to thrive in school.

Lack of affordable childcare is a barrier to accessing employment and education. As one survey respondent said, "If there were more affordable childcare options more people may be able to gain access to employment." There are currently 95 childcare centers in the two county area; just 18 are in Pike County. Pre-K for PA estimates that $78 \%$ of eligible children in Monroe County, and $76 \%$ of eligible children in Pike County, do not have access to highquality, publicly-funded childcare. This is much higher than the state estimate (61\%).

The COVID-19 pandemic has created staffing challenges for childcare providers across the state. A survey conducted by Start Strong PA in March 2022 found that $95 \%$ of providers in Monroe County have a staff shortage and there are 580 children on waiting lists. Similarly, in Pike County, $100 \%$ of providers have a staff shortage and 18 children are on waiting lists.

Several survey respondents indicated that the expense of childcare was prohibited. One shared that "Childcare costs more than my mortgage." Another stated that "I can not afford daycare and am struggling finding friends and family to look after my son. It's putting me in a difficult position, one where I HAVE to work as we can not afford to live on just my husband's income or choosing to stay home to look after my child."

## Wages

The average weekly wage of employees in Monroe and Pike Counties is $\$ 946.37$, or $\$ 49,211$ per year. This is just $79 \%$ of the average wage throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. In the two-county area, private employers have lower weekly wages than government employers. The wages of private employees in Monroe and Pike Counties is just $\$ 892.29$ - only $74 \%$ of wages throughout the state.

Several survey respondents shared the challenges associated with low wages:

- "I can't afford to work or to pay for day care everything is to far I would be working just to pay for gas and day care and still wouldn't be able to pay my bills."
- "The pay for work here is super low to the cost of living and housing."
- "The only jobs that pay high enough wages are about 45 minutes away and with the added cost of gas it doesn't make affordability attainable."
- "I loved living in Monroe county, but when I hit my rough spot due to the lack of resources I had to leave. There were no jobs that paid a living wage, and there was no way for me to find somewhere else to live let alone a shelter or place to keep my stuff. I wish I don't have to move but it had to be done."


## Income

The median household income in Monroe and Pike Counties is higher than the state and country; however, the per capita income in Monroe County is a bit lower than the state and country.

## Poverty

Survey respondents shared several thoughts about the impact of poverty in their lives:

- "Poverty comes in so many forms. Most have a one dimensional idea of poverty."
- "Poverty isn't always starving or living on the street. Sometimes it's struggling to provide even when you are working full time."
- "People have to decide whether to eat or buy medicine or pump gas."
- "Being poor is extremely expensive."
- "The amount of social security a person born with a disability gets isn't enough for rent. Let alone food, utilities, toiletries, and life. As I age I'm terrified what will happen to my son when I'm not here to take care of him and seek out the minimal supports that exists."
- "I feel stuck. There is no room for growth. I feel this system will eventually expose me to poverty"


## People and Households

There are 22,992 people in Monroe and Plke Counties that live in households with income below the poverty level. In the two county service area, about $10.38 \%$ of people live in households with income below the federal poverty guidelines. Low incomes are particularly challenging now due to rising inflation. As one survey respondent noted, "everything is rising but our job wages." From August 2021 to July 2022, the cost of items increased $8.5 \%$. This includes a $44.9 \%$ increase in gasoline, a $13.1 \%$ increase in food eaten at home, and a $5.7 \%$ increase in housing. One survey respondent explained the challenges associated with inflation: "as prices continue to rise, lower income people are going to be forced out of our area. Many of these people are from families who have been here generations. Pushing them to another county is difficult for them because their family and social connections are far from them. Family can no longer be available for child care, medical emergencies, meals and comfort."

## Transportation

Transportation was identified as one of the most important needs in Monroe and Pike Counties by focus group participants. They specifically mentioned the limited availability of public transportation and noted that this constrains access to employment, healthcare, and social services. Survey respondents indicated that public transportation is a major need, particularly in Pike County. Respondents in both counties also shared that the cost of gas is a challenge.

- "Services are hard for most people to get or get to and on their own and are often not utilized because of transportation issues."
- "Lack of reliable efficient transportation affects all aspects of life from accessing healthcare to accessing food."
- "We want to work, but there is no transportation."

The majority of residents in Monroe (77.4\%) and Pike Counties (80.7\%) drive alone to work. Only $3.5 \%$ of Monroe County residents and $1.9 \%$ of Pike County residents use public transportation to and from work.

Survey respondents shared some of the housing-related challenges they have experienced:

- "There is a lack of Section 8 housing in part due to what an owner can get from short term rentals."
- "My landlord sold our home and we now live out of our car or motels."
- "I work hard and am a responsible citizen and I just feel that more affordable and dignified housing options should be available."
- "The cost of rents are geared towards the people who work in New York, but live in PA."
- "Short term rentals (AirBnB) have hurt the housing market. There are over 2000 AirBnBs in the area and many families are homeless, living in hotels or had to move back in with family."
- "Short-term rentals bring down the quality of life and stability of neighborhoods."
- "We are buried in bills and having a difficult time coming up with our rent now that it's an additional $\$ 500$ a month for the next year until we have to move out."

There are 119,135 units of housing in the two-county area. The amount of housing has remained fairly stable over the past 10 years; however, the number of housing units has decreased in Monroe County and increased in Pike County.

## Adult Literacy

About $19.3 \%$ of adults aged 16 to 74 in the two-county service area are at an adult literacy level at or below Level 1. This means that they are at risk for being able to understand printed material. Those at the upper end of Level 1 can read and understand the text well enough to be able to perform small tasks, but might have difficulty understanding or drawing inferences from multiple forms of text. Those at the lower end may struggle with basic vocabulary or even be functionally illiterate.

## Health

Survey respondents identified a lack of healthcare services as a primary concern. While the need for emergency care and specialists was most important in Pike County, the need for mental health counseling was suggested by about $65 \%$ of respondents in both counties. Respondents shared their experiences revealing the interconnectedness of mental health with other needs:

- "I am living in a studio apt with black mold \& have many health issues. I can't afford to even move someplace better for my health. Depression is getting much worse trying to live here."
- "I wish there was a way to just make sure people's basic needs are met. It does a lot for someone's mental health to not have all that worry and nowhere to turn."

## Health Status

The cancer rate per 100,000 people is 490.4 in Monroe County and 454.8 in Pike County (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention). The three most frequent causes of death in both counties are heart disease, cancer, and accidents.

## Healthcare Access

Focus group participants noted that healthcare access is a primary concern. In Plke County, there is not an emergency room or hospital. Both Lehigh Valley Health Network and St. Luke's University Health Network have a presence in Monroe County. In addition, there are a lack of specialists and access to preventative care in both counties. Survey respondents shared their challenges with limited healthcare access:

- "The system is very slow for giving a child mental health issues, but completely non existent for an adult."
- "It's difficult to find doctors that take Medicaid, especially for mental health/counseling."
- "A friend of mine had to have her son placed near Philadelphia for rehab which is a journey from here."
- "I am a disabled senior who can not get help with medical and dental assistance because I make over the limit by less than \$50.00."
- "I recently had to travel to Middletown for their children's ER and then had to transfer to Westchester NY for her care because there was nothing closer that was equipped to treat her. This is scary when you are a parent that has a sick child that the closest one is 40+mins away for any help. I currently have all of her
doctors, pediatrician and the specialists she sees and I see all are in NY or NJ because there are none in the county."
- "Neither me or my husband are offered any kind of health insurance. My child can't even get CHIP. We cannot afford insurance and rent."

There are 39 primary care physicians per 100,000 people in the two-county area. This is much lower than the state (81) and country (76.7).

There are 1.47 physicians per 1,000 residents in the two-county area. This number is much lower in Pike County ( 0.90 ). Comparatively, in Pennsylvania, there are 3.92 physicians per 1,000 residents. While there is a shortage of physicians, there are more nurses per 1,000 people in the two-county area (12.76) than in Pennsylvania (9.41).

There are only 0.17 psychologists per 1,000 people in Monroe and Pike Counties. In comparison, there are 0.43 per 1,000 in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Similarly, the number of mental health providers is particularly low, especially in Pike County. There are 121.1 mental health care providers per 100,000 people in Monroe and PIke Counties while there are 237.7 in the state and 282.3 throughout the country (U.S. Department of Health and Human Services). There are 1.01 therapists, such as physical therapists, occupational therapists, and chiropractors, per 1,000 people in Monroe and pike Counties
while there are 1.83 per 1,000 in Pennsylvania. In Monroe and Pike County, there are 0.67 special health professionals per 1,000 people. This includes dietitians, optometrists, podiatrists, and speech pathologists. In Pennsylvania, there are 1.09 per 1,000. There are nine pharmacies per 100,000 people in Pike County and 14.2 in Monroe County; in Pennsylvania, there are 16.9 per 100,000 people (U.S. Census Bureau, County Business Patterns).

There is also a shortage of dentists in Monroe and Pike Counties. There are 0.82 dental professionals per 1,000 people; in Pennsylvania, there are 1.26 per 1,000. In 2015, the ratio of dentists to population in Monroe and Pike Counties was half of the availability throughout the state and the country. The availability of dentists is particularly low in Pike County ( 17.87 per 100,000 people versus 65.40 in Pennsylvania; U.S. Department of Health and Human Services). While the availability of dentists has grown throughout Pennsylvania and the country over the past 10 years, it has remained fairly stagnant in Monroe and Pike Counties.

## Quality of Life

## Social Service Network

There are many government and nonprofit organizations in the two-county area that work to address the complex causes and conditions of poverty. Focus group participants noted that there is a need to better educate the community about the services that are available and that improved communication and coordination of services by government agencies and nonprofit organizations is needed. A majority of survey respondents noted that there is a need for more services for older adults and legal services.

Survey respondents shared additional experiences and thoughts related to services in Monroe and Pike Counties:

- "There are absolutely no activities for kids unless you have the money to pay for them."
- "People work to hard all their lives and have to live with the indignities they are dealt because of (less face it) the lack of money and resources. It is wrong and we as people need to do better helping each other."
- "People move here because it is cheaper than where they live and it strains services that are all ready in place."
- "Applying for benefits to help with food, rent, utilities, and other services can be somewhat overwhelming and confusing which then leads to frustration and despair. These things should be made simplified along with a greater staff of people willing to help."
- "We do not qualify for any kind of assistance because of our household income. However, with having a disability, my daughter having a disability, unexpected costs of medications due to after effects of covid-19, other medical emergencies and just routine care, needing to purchase special food for medical conditions, we are just barely making it by."
- "COVID makes access more difficult because many services have limited, staff, limited hours or only online access."

## Community Resources and Assets

According to the Pocono Mountains Visitors' Bureau, the four-county Pocono region has the following features:

- 150 lakes
- 19 waterfalls
- More than 127 varieties of trees, shrubs, and plants
- 170 river miles (including the Delaware, Lehigh, and Lackawaxen rivers)
- 122 of river and 11,285 acres of lakes stocked for fishing
- Nine state parks with 35,537 acres
- Two national parks with more than 70,000 acres
- More than 81,000 acres of state forest
- More than 125 hiking trails with more than 260 miles
- More than 30 golf courses
- Four indoor and two outdoor water parks
- Six major ski areas with 636 skiable acres
- More than 15 museums

While there are many natural resources and amenities in both counties, survey respondents shared a disconnect between local residents' needs for recreation and those of the tourists that are attracted to the area:

- The outlets to decompress and have fun are all set up for tourists who are willing to pay big money. But many locals cannot afford such luxury.
- People need to feel like they are part of a community. We need pride in our community, we need fellowship even as we struggle to make a living here.

There is one university in the two-county area: East Stroudsburg University in Monroe County. Lackawanna College has a satellite campus in Hawley, Pike County and Northampton Community College has a campus in Tannersville, Monroe County. These schools provide the opportunity for local residents to pursue a higher education and also enrich the community through continuing education opportunities and performing arts and sporting events.

## Greatest Needs in Monroe and Pike Counties

Based on secondary data, focus groups, and the community survey, the five greatest needs for the region are:

- Housing: Access to affordable, high-quality housing
- Economic Stability: Access to living wage jobs and financial literacy programs
- Health: Opportunities to improve health and access healthcare, including behavioral health services and food access
- Youth Development: Access to childcare and youth activities
- Reduced Barriers to Services: Improved communication and collaboration among service providers, more outreach and education, improved transportation


## Strategies to Address Needs

Strategy 1: Continue to provide core operating support for the local social service network.

Because of the relatively small population, local social service agencies have limited access to core operating support through public and private sources to address the diverse and growting needs of low-income people throughout the region. Community Services Block Grant funding allows these agencies to flexibly address the needs of lowincome people. Monroe Community Action Agency will continue to make funds available to local nonprofit organizations by issuing an annual request for proposals.

## Strategy 2: Streamline the application review process to encourage the participation of low-income people in evaluation of proposals

Monroe Community Action Agency has a thorough system in place to evaluate the quality of proposals and make decisions about the allocation of resources. The intricacy of the proposal evaluation matrix may be intimidating to those who are not experienced with reviewing proposals or are unfamiliar with the terminology used; in addition, effectively using the matrix is time-consuming and it may not be feasible for most people to contribute the hours needed to complete this task. Currently, only two board members participate in the proposal review process. Monroe CAA will streamline the proposal evaluation process so that additional board members are encouraged to participate in the decision-making process.

## Strategy 3: Align the proposal evaluation matrix with the needs identified in this Community Needs Assessment.

The proposal evaluation matrix assigns points to needs from the Community Needs Assessment. This should be changed so that points are assigned for programs and activities that directly address housing, economic stability, health, youth development, and barriers to services. In addition, bonus points will be added to incentivize programs and activities that involve collaboration, leverage resources, and have a strategy or system in place to ensure equitable access to those programs and activities. To effectively evaluate these areas, additional guidance will be added to the request for proposals.

## Strategy 4: Fully utilize the CAPTAIN® Information System.

Monroe Community Action Agency has invested in the CAPTAIN ® Information System; however, due to shifting priorities during the COVID-19 pandemic, it is not fully utilized.

All recipients of Community Services Block Grant funding will be required to use CAPTAIN® for intake, assessment, program enrollment, data management, and referrals to other agencies. Using this system will simplify the process of accessing services across agencies by having a common application for services that only needs to be completed by participants once. In addition, CAPTAIN® will facilitate information sharing across agencies so that individuals' needs are addressed effectively.

## Strategy 5: Ensure that people in the community have access to an up-to-date and comprehensive Information and Referral system.

The regional Information and Referral system is fragmented and can easily become out of date as information changes. Currently, information is managed by PA 211 for Northeast and Pocono Mountains United Way. The latter resource is only available for Monroe County. Monroe Community Action Agency will take the lead on ensuring that people in both counties, as well as Wayne and Carbon counties, have access to complete and accurate information about programs and services through joint planning with Pocono Mountains United Way and 211. Monroe Community Action Agency will support this solution with Community Services Block Grant funding which may be used for a part time staff position, advertising, or other expenses deemed necessary for the project.

Strategy 6: Collaborate with other public and private agencies in neighboring counties to leverage resources and increase the Pocono region's capacity to effectively address needs.

Many programs and services cross county boundaries. In addition, each of the four counties in the Pocono region (Mnroe, Pike, Wayne, and Carbon) are relatively small in population with limited funding and capacity. When feasible, Monroe Community Action Agency will partner with government agencies, nonprofit organizations, and businesses. Such collaboration may include regional planning, joint state, federal, and private funding applications, and coordination of information sharing and service provision.

## Strategy 7: Engage and educate local municipalities about housing needs and opportunities.

Local municipalities will be engaged as partners to address the region's housing needs for low- to moderate-income households. Municipal ordinances - and their enforcement - influence the quality of housing, affordable housing opportunities, and the fair housing rights of individuals. Currently, Pike and Wayne counties coordinate annual fair housing education activities. This effort will be expanded upon by including Monroe and Carbon counties and by also addressing other ways that municipalities can facilitate the availability of safe, affordable housing for all residents through education.

## Adult Literacy

Literacy data published by the Program for the International Assessment of Adult Compentencies (PIACC) breaks adult literacy into three different "Levels". Those reported as Level 1 are at risk for being able to understand printed material. Those at the upper end of Level 1 can read and understand the text well enough to be able to perform small task, but might have difficultly understanding or drawing inferences from multiple forms of text. Those at the lower end may struggle with basic vocabulary or even be functionally illiterate.

The percentage at or below Level 1 for literacy in the report area is estimated at $19.3 \%$, with a $95 \%$ probability that the actual (true, unknown) percentage is between $15.9 \%$ and $22.5 \%$.

## Prenatal Care

Prenatal care significantly factors into the health of pregnant women and the birth of healthy babies. ## Births

Most live births occurred with mothers 20-30 years of age, giving birth to $49.9 \%$ of all births in the report area. The second largest group is mothers $30-40$ years of age, with $42.81 \%$ of births. Mothers over age 40 represent $3.67 \%$ of births.

Of interest are live births by mothers under the age of 19, who gave birth to $3.62 \%$ of all babies in the report area. These births can work against families being self-sufficient. Teen mothers are statistically less likely to continue education through high school and college, without which many may earn only low-income wages. Teen mothers and their children face increased health risk due to lack of education and resources.
