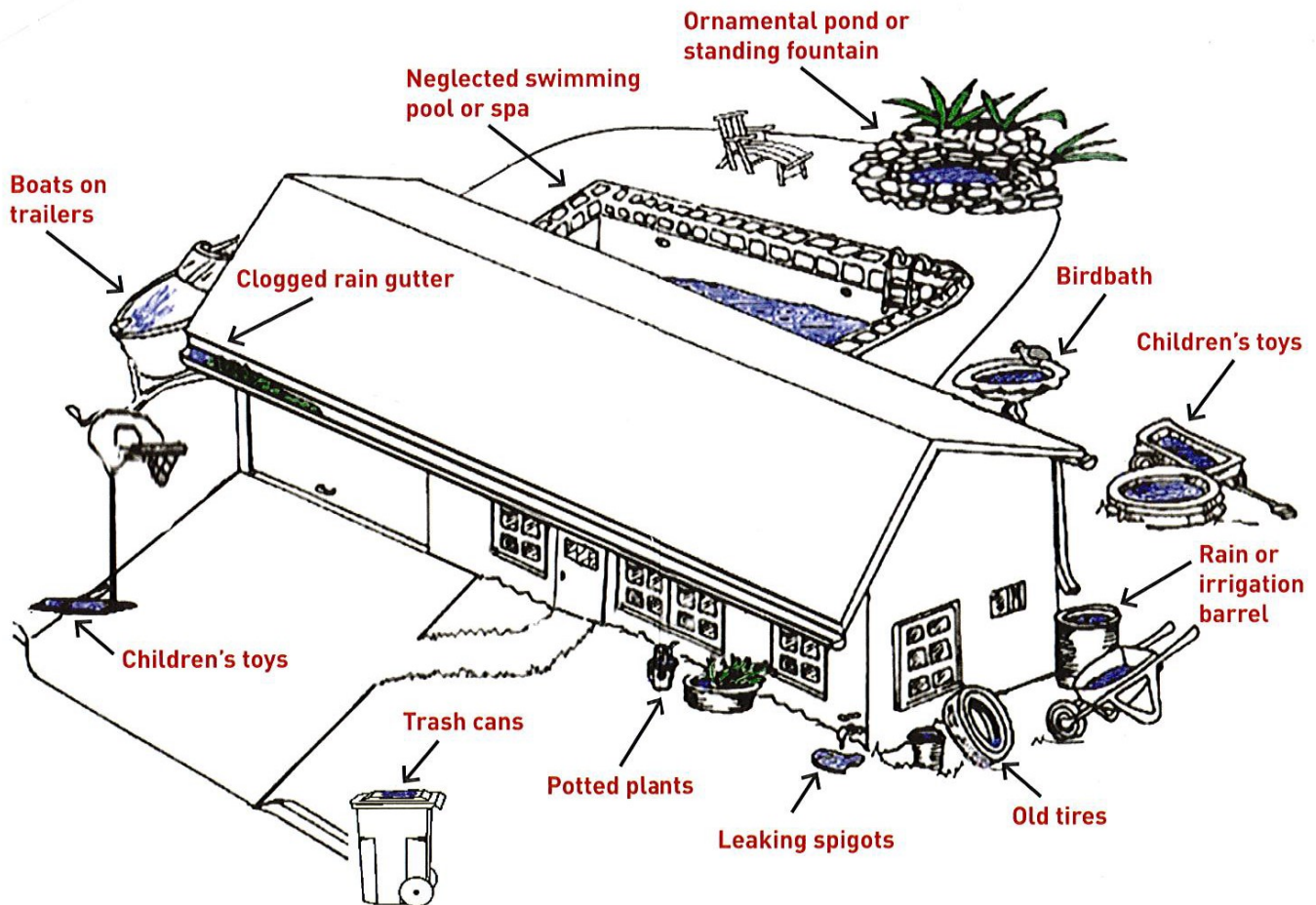


Fight the Bite

Prevent the transmission of mosquito borne diseases such as West Nile Virus by removing mosquito breeding sites



REDUCE YOUR RISK: ELIMINATE BREEDING AREAS

Mosquitoes breed in standing water. You can add to our efforts to prevent the spread of mosquito-borne illness by maintaining items in your yard that collect water.

Fight the Bite



Protect yourself against the transmission of West Nile Virus



DRAIN

standing water in flower pots, pet dishes or clogged gutters, so mosquitoes don't have a place to breed and treat water that can't be drained



DEFEND

use an EPA-approved insect repellent



DRESS

in long sleeves and pants when outdoors



DUSK TILL DAWN

limit outdoor activities in the hours from dusk till dawn when mosquitoes are most active

1. Avoid

Remember to wear long, loose, and light clothing. Close windows if screens are not installed

2. Repel

Use repellent containing DEET

3. Eliminate

Eliminate mosquito breeding grounds.

Empty all containers containing standing water, remove used tires, and clear gutters and drains.
