SPECTACULAR is an 8-to-9-week program held in the local library's Eisemann Room and is attended by 20 to 25 students annually. Volunteers lead the hour-long classes and teach children through hands-on crafts, games, and a new 3D Storytime, which brings the story's visuals to life in an interactive way. The program has been a big success for RSVP and our community. Emma says, "Children and parents love the class, and this motivated all the volunteers in the program to give their best and contribute their professional experience and knowledge to make this a quality program for children to learn Spanish in a creative environment."

According to Emma, "This program teaches preschoolers the Spanish language through music, songs, crafts, and hands-on activities, making learning a joyful experience, which is our main goal. This fall, we are introducing our new and unique Aesop's Fables 3D Storytime, where children can immerse themselves in the story and its characters, helping them develop a love of reading from an early age. So far, a fantastic SPECTACULAR team is working diligently to make this language program a reality in our community."

Emma started with RSVP over 10 years ago. She wanted to explore what she could do in the community, get to know and meet people, and learn about our local culture. Before retiring, she was raising her kids and running a small business with her husband.



When asked what does she say to others to encourage them to join rsvp? She tells them that RSVP is a place where you are welcome in a fun and great environment. Emma adds, "Older adults should volunteer to share their experience and knowledge, especially in intergenerational community programs. Today, children and young people need good role models and guidance."

In her spare time, Emma loves spending time with her family, walking her dogs in the park, reading biographies and philosophy, listening to music, hiking, dancing, and writing.

Community Partner Profile: More Than Just a Meal Meals on Wheels Delivers So Much More

According to recent health assessments, food insecurity is a growing issue in Monroe County, particularly impacting "younger seniors" aged 60–69. The county's food insecurity rate has reached 11.1%, and limited access to nutritious foods often forces residents to turn to unhealthy options such as highly processed foods or fast food. This dietary pattern has led to various health concerns.

To address these needs, AmeriCorps Seniors/RSVP of Monroe County collaborates with Monroe County Meals on Wheels to support home bound individuals, helping them stay safe and independent in their homes. Meals on Wheels goes beyond meal delivery, providing vital nutritional support, daily human interaction, and additional services that enhance clients' overall wellbeing. While meal delivery remains their primary focus, they also offer various other programs to further assist their clients, including a Pet Program designed to support the furry companions of those they serve.





Meals on Wheels has been a pillar of support in Monroe County for over 50 years. Since its inception in 1972 with just 11 clients, the organization with the help of volunteers like RSVP, has grown to serve over 300 individuals today. RSVP joins in supporting their mission to "provide nutritious meals and daily human connection to homebound residents, seniors, and adults with disabilities throughout Monroe County."

According to Executive Director Alyssa Koeck, "As many Meals on Wheels clients are homebound, loneliness can be a significant concern. Pets often provide much-needed companionship, but caring for them can be challenging for those who are unable to leave their homes. That's where the Pet Program comes in. This initiative supplies clients with pet food, treats, and litter, helping them care for their furry friends."



Feature Article: More Than Just A Meal (cont'd)

In addition to meals, Monroe County Meals on Wheels recognizes that many clients need other essential items. The Pantry Program helps fill those gaps by providing shelf-stable foods, household items, cleaning supplies, and personal care products through donations.

Meals on Wheels is always looking for ways to expand its services. They recently began partnering with another RSVP Community Partner, PVEN, to deliver food pantry boxes to home bound clients, increasing their reach and providing further support to those in need. However, these new programs require more volunteer assistance.


